



The Christian spiritual tradition is rich in ways responding to changing circumstances such as those we all currently find ourselves in. for centuries nuns and monks, not least in our village, have practised social distancing for a positive outcome. They have found peace and purpose rooted in one place, in tune with the natural rhythm of creation and the pattern of the seasons.

I would not however want to paint such a life as some peaceful idyll removed from uncomfortable reality. Spiritual life has always had a tradition of struggle, perplexity, restlessness and anxiety, such as afflicts us all at this time. In response to these it has discovered and developed discipline, in other words openness to learning within our limitations. A Christian hermit in a cell is still part of a community of interdependent relationships.

There has been an increase worldwide during the last few months in people revisiting and exploring questions of faith. The Sodality of Mary to which I belong has quadrupled in membership since lockdown, with priests from the Antipodes and the USA adding to our numbers.

Every area of life has had to adapt and our village church is no exception. From the closure of the building to ensuring it was safe to reopen, to services online and so on, we are still learning. Our public services are the most visible aspect of the life of the Church and these have had to adjust in a variety of ways. Looking ahead our PCC has identified in particular a need to address forthcoming special occasions.

We are limited to 30 people in church but may be able to celebrate outside. Please let me know if you plan to come

Remembrance Sunday

We cannot under present restrictions seat the usual number who attend inside church. We are considering holding a service at the memorial to which we would ask people to bring their own seating and if necessary, umbrellas and to maintain social distancing.

At this stage we propose a series of consecutive morning services with tickets to ensure no more than 30 people attend each of them.

Summary of Rusper Parish Council meeting & Planning Committee meeting — July 2020

The full Minutes of these and all other meetings are available to view on the Rusper Parish Council web site rusper-pc.org.uk/meetings. These Minutes are <u>draft and subject to change</u> until they have been confirmed at our next meeting. These meetings were held virtually due to the pandemic.

<u>Council – 28th July 2020</u>

Co-option of new Councillor: Valerie Bender was co-opted and welcomed back to the Council.

August meeting: This will be cancelled unless an urgent matter emerges.

Reports from other Authorities: Cllr. Kitchen reported that the planning application for Stafford House has been recommended for refusal and will be decided at planning committee, there is a licence application for the Frog and Nightgown, a meeting has not yet taken place with Highways about the layby in Lambs Green.

Licence application: This was not sent to RPC for consultation, but Members wanted to ask for the licence to be put in place on a temporary basis so that impact to neighbours can be considered, and that the music on Sundays is restricted to an 8pm finish.

Notice boards: Two new notice boards will be bought at a cost of £3670 plus VAT from a local supplier.

VE Day commemoration: The local event for this was cancelled due to the pandemic and so it was proposed that budgeted money be put towards either a new gate for the playground, a WW1/WW2 information board, or commemoration bench. It was agreed to ask the History Group if they can find any relevant information.

Playground: It was agreed to reopen this subject to new terms and conditions and signage.

Playground inspection: This was done in February, and all items are showing as low risk. There are some minor works required.

Neighbourhood Plan update: The Independent Examiner has raised some questions, which have now been responded to. The Examiner should make a decision soon on whether or not to make any changes.

Report from representatives:

- Gatwick Airport has been actively undertaking a lot of activity relating to noise and pollution. The plans for the northern runway are moving ahead, but this are dependent on the restoration of air travel.
- RPC will write to the local MP to ask for the Local Plan timeline to be pushed back.

- The Rusper sign will be treated with Cuprinol.
- The Sports Pavilion is currently closed due to the pandemic.
- Volunteer deliveries for the shop have now stopped.

Clerk's report:

- The websites have failed their accessibility audits, but there are only a few corrections to make.
- Various correspondence has been received from Communities Against Gatwick Noise and Emissions.
- Highways will allow RPC to replace the oak bollards on the High Street. The Clerk is getting quotes for this.
- The ground sockets for the Speed Indicator Device have now been ordered by Highways.
- An Estate Management Plan for Land North of Horsham is now available for comments.

Planning – 21st July 2020

Agreed responses to planning applications:

<u>DC/20/1078 Sports Horses International, Stud Farm</u>: Rusper Parish Council does not object to this application, but notes that this is an unsuitable location for residential development.

<u>DC/20/1077 Sports Horses International, Stud Farm:</u> Rusper Parish Council does not object to this application, but notes that this is an unsuitable location for residential development.

<u>DC/20/1058 Land adjacent to Stumbleholme Cottage</u>: Rusper Parish Council has no objections to this application provided that a waste management scheme is accepted by environmental health, that there is no risk of runoff to the river and that there is a scheme in place to deal with disposal of waste.

<u>DC/20/1110 Severn Cottage, Charlwood Road</u>: Rusper Parish Council objects to this application for the following reasons:

- The previous consent has lapsed so it should be treated as a new application.
- The height of the building is not suitable.

<u>DC/20/1062 Ashfold Cottage, Horsham Road</u>: Rusper Parish Council objects to this application as the height of building is out of keeping with area and goes above the hedge line.

<u>DC/20/1173 Bonwycks Lodge Farm, Ifield Wood</u>: Rusper Parish Council does not object to this application provided that it remains ancillary accommodation to the main building.

<u>DC/20/1179 The Old Coach House, Wimlands Lane</u>: Rusper Parish Council does not object to this application.

<u>DC/20/1191 Land South of Star Cottages, Horsham Road</u>: Rusper Parish Council does not object to this application but requests that trees with a less invasive root system are replanted in order to protect the conservation area. Please be aware that this land is under the control of the brewery to The Star; this doesn't seem apparent in the application.

<u>DC/20/1255 33 Wimlands Cottages, Wimland Road</u>: Rusper Parish Council does not object to this application but would like additional information about materials used and confirmation that they won't alter the appearance of the building.

<u>DC/20/1241 Prestwood Paddock, Prestwood Lane</u>: Rusper Parish Council objects to this application. It is felt that this application would have been refused due to the overall scale of building, if applied for correctly, as over-development in a rural setting and non-sustainable location with no public transport. Rusper PC also has serious concerns about adequate drainage being in place.

<u>DC/20/1245 Benhams Barn, Friday Street</u>: Rusper Parish Council does not object to this application.

Rusper Village Stores (RVS) – Annual General Meeting and Update.

It would be fair to say that even without the Coronavirus pandemic it has been an eventful year for the shop. Following Covid guidelines on public meetings, RVS has had to cancel its AGM, planned to be held in the Village Hall at the end of September. Instead information packs will be available for Shareholders, and interested parties to collect from the shop, similar to those circulated at the AGM.

In the summer we celebrated 20 years as a community owned village store and had a very well attended hog roast party to mark the occasion. Also after 18 years of dedicated service, David Manning left the shop for pastures new, and Kieran Widdows joined us to take over as the new shop manager.

Kieran was welcomed by an intensification of our computer problems, exacerbated by the efforts of Thames Water to make the shop much less accessible with on-going road closures from September almost through to March.

Despite these setbacks, and the need to control customer numbers in the shop to ensure social distancing, the business has recovered to thrive in the local community. The provision of a delivery service proved popular, provided by staff with some help from volunteers during the height of the pandemic, and this continues for the vulnerable in the parish.

In difficult trading conditions the shop achieved Sales of £459k, £20k or 4% down on the prior year. Gross Margins levels were sustained at over 27%, and despite increased costs, particularly in terms of bank charges - up nearly 40% to over £5k - a minor profit of just under £1k was achieved. The shop received some support in the form of a small business grant from local government, which was very

helpful, and latterly has managed to obtain some compensation for loss of profit from Thames Water.

Most importantly I should like to thank all our customers who have supported the shop throughout the year, and helped the business to succeed through a difficult period, and continue to flourish into this year, helping it to be a key focal point for the parish. Thank you for your patience with queuing systems and alterations to opening times necessitated by IT problems and social distancing measures. Kieran and his team have done a superb job with good humour, and continue to do so. We hope to expand the range of products and services provided by the shop in the coming months, so keep a look out for new developments... and new fridges and freezers....

Rusper Chronicle local history group

Due to Covid19 we have not been able to meet for the past few months, and now our plans to start well-distanced meetings again have been stopped by new government rules. However history research has been continuing, partly focussed on Rusper churchyard.

One interesting finding is that quite a few of those buried in the churchyard had strong Indian connections — through the Indian army, H.M. Civil Service or through railway building. What stands out is the high price often paid by wives and children, especially in the 1800's. One example of this is the story of Margaret Georgiana Seton-Karr.

In the churchyard there is a very large granite slab, lying flat, very close to the south wall of the church and close to the entry to the Broadwood vault. Now the writing is almost illegible, but we know what it says — we are very fortunate in Rusper that Jean Shelley recorded the graves in the church yard in 1980, and equally fortunate that in 1873 a clergyman, Ernest Ellman, also published a list of the graves in the Sussex Archaeological Collections.

This is what is on the stone: "Margaret Georgiana Seton-Karr daughter of Walter Scott Seton-Karr of H.M. Indian Civil Services and Eleanor Katherine his wife, born at Jessore, Bengal. February 3rd 1859, died October 7th 1868". Also on the stone are commemorated a brother, born in 1857 who died at birth in India, and a sister Virginia Sophia, also born in India in 1866 who died aged 4 months. Little Margaret Katherine was nine years old. She had an unusual surname for Rusper. So why was she buried here? It was fairly easy to track down her father's prestigious career in the Indian Civil Service. His unusual Christian names of Walter Scott were because the famous writer was his godfather. His brother was also out in India in the Civil Service. But what was the connection with Rusper? A guess was that they were in some way related to the Broadwood family at Lyne, partly from the position of the grave near the Broadwood vault, and also that the stone next to it is to Kathleen Eleanor Longfield, a niece from Ireland, who was staying at Lyne when she died aged 26 in 1870. The Seton-Karrs were certainly in the Broadwood social circle – at the "wedding of the year" between Henry the second son of Henry Fowler Broadwood and Miss Ada Randolph Heath at Anstie Grange, Holmwood, their gift of a cabinet was listed in the local paper. Whether they were actually related we don't know, though there is a mention of a Harry Cust – this was Margaret's mother's maiden name – in Lucy Broadwood's diaries, so perhaps there was a relationship through Margaret's mother?

Imagine how shocked we were to find that Margaret Georgiana, aged nine, had died at Earlswood Asylum (as it was called then), near Redhill. In the 1861 Census she is aged two, living with her maternal grandparents in London – her grandfather is listed as a clergyman, Canon at Windsor – who died that same year. We don't know where she was living for the next seven years, till she was admitted to Earlswood four months before her death. Earlswood was a newly built asylum to care for those with mental disabilities who would previously have been kept in the workhouse and was opened in 1855 by Prince Albert. The

medical superintendent was John Langdon Down, who identified Downs Syndrome and gave it its name. Did little Margaret have Downs Syndrome? We know her father was back in India the month she died. Was her mother also back there? Two other brothers were born in India, Robert in 1861, and Walter in 1865, who survived and were at their father's funeral in 1910. To lose three children out of five. all born in India, is a very great loss, and it is sad to think of Margaret too buried alone here in Rusper far from her family.

There are happier stories! Janet Wise, for example, who died only recently, has "born in Simla" on her gravestone – she must have felt her Indian connection was important to her. There are so many more stories to tell of people who were born, lived or worked in India but ended their lives in Rusper. We hope to tell some of them. Meanwhile let us remember little Margaret Georgiana. Margaret White


